Ways to make Theme Park Vacations Less Expensive

- Most theme parks will refill drink containers at a much reduced rate and will fill them with ice water for free... all you have to do is ask.
- Pack your snacks in a backpack, or even your lunch and enjoy an impromptu picnic with your family.
- Leave the park for a picnic lunch packed in a cooler in your car.
- Choose multi-day tickets if you will be in the area for a few days. If you live close by, a season pass is a great idea!

Some of the most relaxing Family Vacations can be had at our country's National Parks.




The National Park Service has a fantastic web site set up to provide information on all the National Parks in the United States....

Big Cities have great Children's museums, restaurants, tours, museums, and many other great vacation ideas....

Some of our favorite Big Cities are....

New York City

One of our best family vacations was a trip to **New York City with Children**. Believe it or not, YES - you can add New York City to the list of kid friendly vacations.

We have traveled to <u>New York City with children</u> several times. Over the years, we have enjoyed staying in the Times Square area more than some of the other areas. (Side note: You can get great rates on New York City hotels on <u>hotwire</u>). In the previous trip, traveled to the Times Square area, but left to return to our hotel.... if we returned late, there was nothing open to grab a bite to eat.... Not a problem in Times Square... You can get a sandwich at 3:00 AM if you want to!

Some great <u>things to do in New York City</u> are Times Square, Broadway Plays, Central Park, the Empire State building, the Carnegie Deli, and Coney Island. We also took in a New York Yankees baseball game, and a New York Mets game.

The Statue of Liberty was one of our favorite attractions. There were great views of New York from the Ferry, and the statue was great to see. We took an opportunity to have a family vacation photograph made by the park rangers of our family with the statue in the background!!!

We really enjoyed our walk on The Brooklyn Bridge. The bridge is an icon in Brooklyn, New York, and is the number one attraction there. The bridge starts in the lower Manhattan area of New York and is absolutely majestic.

One afternoon while milling around downtown, we took in the NBC Studio Tour. It was a great tour and included some great trivia and history of NBC. I highly recommend taking in this tour.

San Francisco

San Francisco is another great Big City for a Kid Friendly Vacation.

We enjoyed all of the sights and sounds of <u>San Francisco</u> including the world famous cable cars. San Francisco is such a beautiful city.... San Francisco is such a diverse "Big City". We found an amazing number of things to do:

 Downtown San Francisco - While in San Francisco, we enjoyed riding the Cable Cars, shopping in Union Square, shopping and eating in Chinatown, viewing the Golden Gate Bridge from many different



vantage points as well as driving on it, Ghirardelli Square, Pier 39, and Fisherman's Wharf.

- Alcatraz We took the ferry to Alcatraz Island, and took the tour of the prison and the island. An audio tour was a part of the tour package and was a great way to tour the facility.
- Major League Baseball During our weeklong stay, we enjoyed two major league baseball games. Major League baseball is a very kid friendly family vacation idea. It is reasonably priced, and the stadiums offer a great family experience.
- National Parks We visited several great National Park locations within the city and within easy driving distance. We visited Fort Point - located at the foot of the Golden Gate Bridge, Crissy Field, Muir

Woods, and The Presidio. But the ultimate National Park visit of the trip was to The Yosemite National Park.

 Side Trips - We visited several towns and attractions including Santa Cruz, The Jelly Belly Factory in Fairfield, Wine Country -Napa, The Winchester Mystery House in San Jose, and Great America Theme Park in Santa Clara.









<u>Chicago</u>

We have included Chicago Travel with children into our family vacations two times.

Let me preface this Chicago Travel review by saying that because both of our visits were during cold months, many of the wonderful outdoor activities that Chicago has to offer were not visited. These include the Chicago Zoo and a Chicago Cubs baseball game. Even though the weather was cold during both visits, we found many indoor activities that the kids really enjoyed. There are many fun <u>things to do in Chicago</u>.




A must-see destination with kids in Chicago is the Willis Tower. The Willis Tower is now the tallest building in the United States after the collapse of the World Trade Center

on 9/11. The elevator to the top is unbelievably fast and your ears will pop on the way up.

You can also sample Chicago Deep dish pizza at a good Italian restaurant that is only a couple of blocks from the Willis tower. <u>Giordano's</u> has several locations in the downtown Chicago area. The atmosphere is very simple, but the pizza was as good as advertised and very filling.

The Hancock building is the second tallest building and the view from the observation deck is actually more spectacular than the Sears tower because of the proximity of the building to the waterfront and Lake Shore Drive below. The kids enjoyed the view from the Hancock Observatory and Tower more than the Willis tower. The kids also enjoyed a trip to the navy pier. This shopping and dining complex is located on Lake Michigan and most of the shopping area goes out into the water. There are several specialty shops and restaurants including Chicago Travel souvenir stores. A lot of the restaurants have outdoor seating, in the summertime and there is a huge Ferris wheel at the back



of the dock. The girls really enjoyed all the shopping opportunities along Lake Michigan Avenue. There a

One of our trips out of the immediate downtown area was to the Field Museum south of Downtown adjacent to **Soldier Field (Home of the Bears)** This is a very good museum with the quality of exhibits as good as or better than the Smithsonian. One of the best parts of the museum is a huge collection of stuffed animals from all over the world. The animals are placed in natural type environments and the collection is extensive. There are also many cultural exhibits throughout the museum.

- Choose your hotel room through <u>hotwire.com</u> We usually find great deals though them – even in large cities!
- Only eat one meal out per day you need to experience the food in different areas, but a lunch out may be just the ticket!
- Limit your activities, and choose free options like parks and walking tours

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
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
